"Come and see what I am up to ". So said a dis- embodied voice from an open window of the bungalow that Felicity Anne and I happened to be passing as we walked the dogs. We did as we were invited. Once inside, even I could see that despite the enormity of the task our friend was undertaking, it was the work of a craftsman. Everything neatly set out and beginning to take shape. It was a joy to behold. The same farmer has a reputation for running his farm with equally meticulous expertise. What was true of him is true of so many of our local farmers.

It has been my privilege to speak at the funeral of many of them at their funerals. All friends. Despite farming on Less Favoured Land they were masters of their craft. They knew and cared for each of their beasts as if it had been one of their own children. They knew how to work the land. How to lay and to trim their hedges. How to ensure that their gates were properly hung. Even within tight budgets, their buildings were still in good repair. Our local farming community must be one of the best in the world.

But gifts come in all sorts of shapes and sizes. Round here hospitality and homemaking are at their best and to visit is to be offered not just a welcome but a feast. Just think of the goodies that are produced at every Harvest Supper, Show or Charity event.

And then there are those people whose gifts of expertise, love and care take the form of helping to run our Parish Council or being members of organisations like Cancer Research or a First Responder. Our benefice Newsletter reminds us of their endless generosity and skill. Even within a small community like ours, people are here with and for one another

So it is that In this letter I want to say to so many of you (who ever since we arrived as Off Comers 21 years ago) have surrounded us with your friendship and kindness Thank You. Throughout my 60 years of ministry we have always been lucky enough to have been on the receiving end of other people's love and care, but never more than here. We are deeply and hugely grateful.

But I want to say two other things.

First. So much of that kindness, care and expertise happen spontaneously. There's never any sense of it being contrived as if to earn an MBE or public recognition. It just happens - whether the skill of a farmer or home maker, the wisdom and concern of a volunteer, a kindly word or the sharing of a smile. Just a spontaneous sharing of so many of those God given gifts we have all been given (however seemingly small). Everyone has something to give and you do so in good measure.

Last. Be sure always to try to affirm and say thank you to those around you, wherever you see excellence in action. Many many years ago now I remember saying to a particularly difficult teenager who had had a rotten childhood and who seemed always to take a delight in rubbing up everyone around him the wrong way, but had on this one occasion done something particularly thoughtful and kind "Well done and thank you. I really admire you for what you did ". He stopped what he was doing and replied, "Thank you for saying that. You know, nobody has ever said anything like that to me before". It cost me nothing to say. But what I had said had meant just everything.

When it comes to being practical I fail. Binder twine is my solution to most problems! Indeed I have even suggested that when my time comes, the family tie a piece of orange binder twine on one of the handles of my coffin!

But I hope I shall be remembered as someone who genuinely tried to affirm to love and to care for all those around with the kind of Love and care that I believe God has for me. And that is a way of life that can go for any of us, at any time and in any way.
